

<p><b><u>Textiles</u></b></p> <p>Christmas Unit</p>	<p><b>Straight Stitch (Christmas Tree)</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>To know why and what straight stitch is used for</li> <li>To look at real life examples</li> <li>Can thread a needle with large hole</li> <li>To practise straight stitch on material</li> <li>To use a straight stitch with a given template</li> <li>Use straight stitch on a given textile (Christmas card)</li> <li>To design and cut template for a Christmas tree decoration.</li> <li>To join fabrics with increasing independence and using straight stitch</li> <li>To make a Christmas tree</li> </ul>	<p><b>Whip Stitch (Christmas Stocking)</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Can thread a needle with a large hole and tie a knot</li> <li>To know why and what a whip stitch is used for</li> <li>To look at real life examples</li> <li>To practise whip stitch</li> <li>Use a whip stitch with a given template and textile</li> <li>To use sewing skills more accurate</li> <li>Assemble their stocking using whip stitch</li> <li>Identify the features, benefits and disadvantages of a range of using whip stitch</li> <li>Write design criteria and design a stocking that satisfies the criteria.</li> </ul>	<p><b>Blanket Stitch (Christmas Pudding)</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Can thread a small hole needle and tie a knot</li> <li>To know why and what a blanket stitch is used for</li> <li>To look at real life examples</li> <li>To practise blanket stitch before applying</li> <li>Design a Christmas decoration using textiles</li> <li>Use blanket stitch to secure textiles</li> <li>Use a template to mark and cut out a design.</li> <li>To attach a piece of material and apply the skill of running stitch</li> <li>Demonstrate an awareness of seam allowance</li> <li>Evaluate the final product</li> </ul>	<p><b>Cross Stitch (Christmas bauble)</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Can correctly choose a needle to use for the chosen fabric</li> <li>Can precisely thread a small hole needle and tie a knot</li> <li>To know why and what cross stitch is used for</li> <li>To look at real life examples</li> <li>To practise cross stitch</li> <li>To apply cross stitch to a chosen design</li> <li>To design and make a Christmas bauble</li> <li>To add detail to a Christmas bauble using cross stitch.</li> <li>Use Binca to create a cross-stitch pattern (optional)</li> </ul>

<p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>Collage</u></b></p> <p>Mother's day or Easter</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Mix Media Layering</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• To look at examples of mix media layering</li> <li>• To know layering different materials can create new textures and effects.</li> <li>• Recap quickly on painting and brushstrokes to create a background</li> <li>• Children to create a simple background</li> <li>• To practise ripping or cutting desired shapes</li> <li>• Add ripped or cut shapes onto a background to create a mix media layer</li> </ul>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>3D collage</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Discuss 3D and how it differs from 2D art</li> <li>• Show examples of 3D collages</li> <li>• To know 3D collage creates depth in a picture</li> <li>• To practise ripping, cutting and precisely cutting shapes</li> <li>• To practise folding edges to create a 3D effect</li> <li>• Create 3D image by layering shapes/objects to create texture</li> </ul>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Mosaic</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• To know that mosaic has been used for decoration for centuries (Roman and Byzantine mosaics)</li> <li>• Look at examples of ancient and modern mosaics (suggestion – mosaics in Saltburn)</li> <li>• To understand basic design principles: symmetry, repetition, and patterns.</li> <li>• To know individual tiles are called tesserae</li> <li>• Arrange tiles to create clear patterns or images.</li> <li>• Create own collage through different techniques using tiles (tesserae).</li> </ul>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Overlapping using digital media</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Recap on overlapping and how it creates depth</li> <li>• Show examples of traditional and digital artwork where overlapping is used (magazines, posters)</li> <li>• Introduce digital software (canva) Demonstrate how to layer shapes using the shape tools.</li> <li>• To know how transparency affects overlapping using digital tools on Canva</li> <li>• To add text to create another layer</li> <li>• To create a final piece using layering, transparency and text.</li> </ul>

<p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>Printing</u></b></p> <p style="text-align: center;">Father's Day</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Fabric Printing</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• To know what fabric printing is and why/ what it is used for</li> <li>• Look at examples of printed fabric in everyday life</li> <li>• Talk about how we can stamp, roll, or press objects to create a print</li> <li>• Decide which way will be best for the material</li> <li>• Practise printing on chosen fabric following a given pattern</li> <li>• Discuss how the colours/pattern might change on the different fabrics</li> <li>• Choose correct fabric and print following a pattern</li> </ul>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Collagraph Printing</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• To know what collagraph print is</li> <li>• Look at examples of collagraph printing</li> <li>• Look at the materials you could use to create a print</li> <li>• Design a simple pattern thinking about the materials</li> <li>• Practise using string, bubble wrap and match sticks to create a print</li> <li>• Decide which one worked best for their pattern</li> <li>• Use materials string/bubble wrap or match sticks to create their decided 3D image</li> <li>• Use ink/paint to print</li> </ul>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Lino Print</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• To know what lino printing is and what it has been used for</li> <li>• Look at examples of lino printing in everyday life</li> <li>• Discuss negative (carved area) and positive spaces (what is left behind) on the print</li> <li>• Look at the tools used to create the sketch</li> <li>• Talk about safety using the tools</li> <li>• Practise creating simple lines/shapes into board thinking about negative and positive spaces</li> <li>• Design a pattern</li> <li>• Test design and make changes</li> <li>• Create final print etched into board and print</li> </ul>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Layered Mono Printing</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Understand what mono printing is and how it works</li> <li>• Understand why we use mono printing</li> <li>• To know how to create a layer by mono printing</li> <li>• Explore different mark-making techniques using a variety of natural materials</li> <li>• Practise using the materials to create a desired effect</li> <li>• Create a mono print design using these techniques</li> <li>• Make changes to design if needed</li> <li>• Complete final print</li> </ul>
